India's Biggest Convention Centre

Delhi will soon become a preferred destination for big corporate houses to host their seminars and conventions. DDA is to clear the decks for work to start the proposed international convention centre in Dwarka. The convention centre with a seating capacity of 12,000 will be the biggest in the country. The Rs 2,000 crore state-of-the-art centre, located 5 km from the international airport, will have facilities such as convention hall, auditoriums, conference rooms, exhibition space etc. According to DDA's

chief architect, the idea is to have facilities which compliment each other, thereby making the centre financially sustainable. DDA has set the process of inviting tenders and the centre is to be completed in time for the 2010 Commonwealth Games. The consultants have already submitted the project report. The new convention centre will be based on the public-private partnership model in which DDA will own the land while the private developer would build, operate and run the centre, says DDA.
